COURSE SUGGESTIONS:

Literature – may be any literature course taught in English or in a foreign language

Aesthetics – A&D 255; MUS 250; THTR 201; ENGL 386, 387, 405; PHIL 106 are the most common courses to fill this requirement.

Philosophy – any philosophy course except a logic course (PHIL 150).

Laboratory Science – one science course must have a laboratory; typical choices are ASTR 263, 264; CHM 111; EAS 110, 220;; SCI 104, 105, 112, 113.
