

Minor in Human Services

18 credit hours required for graduation

Description

A minor in Human Services will prepare students to act as a multi-disciplinary practitioner when assisting individuals, families, and communities to respond to events that require intervention. The generic competencies of the human service professional will reflect the continuum of skills necessary to work with persons whose needs arise from problems within the larger social system or to improve individual social functioning. These areas include crime and delinquency, chemical abuse and addiction, poverty, education, job training and employment, again, mental illness physical and sexual abuse, homelessness and disability.
